 Burn injury flowchart developed for firefighters and managers. Vast majority of burns do not need a burn center, but they do need evaluated and treated as soon as possible with transfer to a burn center later if necessary. Follow up care is extremely important. Video consultations with a burn center are available in some cases. American Burn Association released new guidelines. New protocols take the decision to go to a burn center out of the hands of the firefighter. Immediate care at the closet facility is the most important step. Protocols will be posted on the NWCG website. Flow chart will go in the Redbook and the next cycle of the IRPG. 	Communication: Link to existing WFSTAR materials or create new as appropriate to convey these protocols.
 Review NWCG Standards for First Aid Briefing Paper: First Aid Standards were developed after years of work and back and forth for consensus. Effort is intended to increase efficiency at initial response to an injury as the current training does not currently match the needs of our firefighters. Basic first aid skill level for every firefighter. Focus on using the Medical Incident Report. Increase the number of first aid kits and streamline what they contain. Tie back to the pink pages in the IRPG. Set a standard for basic training. Goal is to publish February 2023. Minimum standard will be achieved in different ways within agencies. Responsibility for meeting a standard belongs to the agencies to execute. This standard is intended to be used as a supplement to whatever basic first aid course being taught. 

Incident Workforce Development Group Update:	N/A
 National Multi-Agency Coordinating Group (NMAC) issued a memorandum to the geographic areas requesting how many Complex Incident Management Teams (CIMTs) will be available for 2023. All CIMT and Type 1 teams will be in one national rotation. Revised rotation anticipated to start in February. Full proposed rotation plan will be implemented in 2024. Incident Commanders' Advisory Council (ICAC) provided response to tasking on CIMT configuration: NMAC meeting today to discuss. NWCG EB approved Incident Position Standards Committee (IPSC) recommendations to the NWCG Standards for Wildland Fire Position Qualifications, PMS 310-1. IPSC currently drafting a memorandum for transition plan. NIMSIC has now been engaged in the tasking. Coordination with Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA): Last month, FEMA offered overall support for process to adopt CIM as a part of NIMS. They do not foresee any issues with CIM as an option for state and local government to meet NIMS requirements and qualification for federal grant funding. Bender, Griffin, and FEMA liaison have draft joint communication clarifying this with plans to release in early 2023. NIMSIC emphasis on need for all hazards training for Command and General staff (C&G).
