## **Topic & Notes Decision/Action Item** Emergency Medical Committee (EMC) response to the Rum Creek Serious Accident Corrective APPROVAL to closeout TM-24-003 and **Actions (TM-24-003):** acceptance of EMC recommendations. • EMC was tasked with leading a joint effort with the Risk Management Committee (RMC) and the National Interagency Aviation Committee (NIAC) to address TM-24-003, which is the last outstanding tasking memorandum from the Big Swamp and Rum Creek Serious Accident Corrective Action Plans. o Consider whether additional factors should be included in the Medical Incident Report (MIR) section of the NWCG Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG), PMS 461. o Evaluate and update as necessary, the Medical Plan (ICS 206 WF) to improve the understanding of the medical capabilities of aircraft. • After evaluation, the working team does not recommend changing or updating the MIR section of the IRPG or the ICS 206 WF with air evacuation factors or medical capabilities of aircraft. • This type of information is captured in the recently approved (March 2025) Air Operations Summary (ICS 220 WF), and the *IRPG* updates for Helicopter Extraction Operations addresses the considerations for air evacuation. • EMC will continue to improve and update the MIR and ICS 206 WF on their normal cycle. **Incident Performance and Training Modernization (IPTM) - Monthly Update:** Executive Board members are encouraged to review the SMEs list **Training Program Priorities:** associated with upcoming positions to o Emphasizing clear policies and expectations for supervisors across the program area. ensure agency representation is adequate.

**Decision/Action Item** 

A comprehensive rewrite of the training program's standard operating procedures (SOPs) is underway. This includes both internal operational procedures and external collaboration protocols, particularly regarding interactions with the committees.

- o Bi-weekly meetings with the Wildland Fire Learning Portal team are ongoing.
  - We anticipate delivering tangible products from this collaboration by the end of the year.
- An initial evaluation strategy, standardizing Kirkpatrick levels, has been drafted. This is coupled with a maintenance plan designed to facilitate proactive work planning, reducing reactive responses.
  - This approach will enable us to better articulate staffing and funding requirements and effectively communicate new priorities to the Executive Board (EB).
- Current NWCG Training Development Program Projects:
  - S-212, Wildland Fire Chainsaws Preparations are in progress for a test course.
    - S-290, Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior/S-390, Wildland Fire Behavior Calculations/S-490, Advanced Fire Behavior Calculations — These courses are in their final editing phase.
    - S-229, Single Resource Boss NWCG is currently engaged in design and media production, with an anticipated availability in Spring 2026.
  - L-280, Followership to Leadership Publications is conducting a final review.

- o Call Order 7 Contract deliverables accepted.
- Firing Boss, Single Resource (FIRB) and Helicopter Crewmember (HECM) In final approval stage, requesting certification soon.
  - Lessons learned from the project will be applied to streamline future processes.
  - o Transitioning from start-from-scratch approach to a more efficient gap analysis.
    - This aims to reduce development time and maximize engagement with subject matter experts (SMEs).
  - o Potential Risks:
    - Position Stewards and SMEs making decisions without considering broader systematic impacts.

- A critical risk to meeting the 2028 deadline is the lack of fully trained Training Specialists. Contractors cannot fill this gap due to the essential requirement of fire experience for this work.
- A link highlighting all positions in progress, associated SMEs, and any vacancies has been provided to the EB.
  - EB members are requested to collaborate with committee representatives to address any critical staffing gaps they identify.
- Ongoing engagement from SMEs is crucial for the success of these initiatives, and we have observed a decline in participation, which impacts project timelines and places more work on training specialists.
- IPTM Position Status:
  - Firefighter Type 1 (Squad Boss/FFT1) Incident Position Standards and Next Generation Position Task Book (Next Gen PTB) in final review. The S-130, Firefighter Training, test course that was originally scheduled for Florida has been cancelled; a new location and date will be announced soon.
  - M-280, Wildland Fire Resource Advisor The 12-hour test course is scheduled for August 26, Redwood National Park.
    - o S-203, Introduction to Incident Information This course is in the design and development phase. A test course is scheduled for November 17-21, Las Vegas.
  - 14 positions that were initiated this spring were closed out last Friday.
- Contracting:
  - o Call Order 3 and 7 Both of these call orders have been successfully closed out.
  - o Call Order 8 In planning stages and have requested the remaining funds from the Office Wildland Fire (OWF) to support.
  - o Call Order 9 This call order is specifically intended to address staffing vacancies.
  - o Call Order 10 The call order will cover the 64 remaining positions.

## **Incident Management Team Course Steering Committee (IMTCSC) – Update:**

- S-320, Introduction to Incident Management Teams The charlie test course was successfully completed.
- Anticipate finalizing all edits by August 1, 2025, with certification expected by December 1, 2025.
- S-420 'intermediate' course development Received the initial edits from the contractor.

The transition plan will be added to the agenda for the September EB Meeting.
