<p>Wildland Fire Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT) Updated Charter Review and Update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reworking MPHAT charter: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Maintain a core group and incorporate Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) as needed. ○ MHPAT could become a point of contact (POC) for research opportunities. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Establishment of research priorities. ○ Expand focus to mental health, all infectious disease, and environmental hazards. ○ Intention to be a resource for NWCG Subcommittees. ○ Provide mental health experts for the Mental Health Subcommittee (MHSC). ○ Addition of NWCG representative to the conversation. • With the addition of Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) funding Firefighter health and wellbeing programs will be expanded. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Growth in this area is critical. • Update on COVID testing: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Unvaccinated personnel in medium and high community spread areas, direction is to test weekly. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Intent is that units/incidents follow the direction at the local level. ○ Forest Service is including ADs in testing guidance. ○ DOI guidance is with solicitors. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Bureaus are to develop testing plan and implement. ○ Concerns with capacity to administer tests, availability of medical personnel and tests, and procurement. ○ Need tiered plan for units/incidents to follow. ○ Can offer tests to personnel but cannot require. 	<p>Add MPHAT Charter topic to July 6th FMB meeting.</p> <p>Requesting comments from FMB members.</p> <p>MPHAT to draft Implantation Guide to supplement Agency policy guidance.</p>
