Rationale/Notes:

- No endorsement recommended due to the wildland fire knowledge and experience required of a COMT. Many all-hazards COMTs work off existing systems in developed areas and don't building them from scratch. Most all-hazards COMTs set up comm plans and distribute radios that are working on an existing system.
- Endorsement recommended if the NWCG COMT position requirements are upgraded to include S-130, S-190, L-180, and S-258.

Additional NWCG Requirements:

*To require S-130, S-190, L-180, and S-258 for all-hazards personnel, NWCG needs to require them for wildland fire personnel. The ILSC is putting a task team together to evaluate. Will need to reevaluate if the NWCG COMT qualifications are revised.

Summary:

The analysis team determined that:

- SPUL, FACL, and MEDL endorsement recommended. The endorsement will include additional NWCG requirements as identified above.
- GSUL endorsement recommended. Since the position requirements are identical for both NQS and NWCG, no additional training or experience will be required.
- FDUL no endorsement recommended due to the knowledge and experience required by a FDUL in managing the National Mobile Food Services contract.
- COML no endorsement recommended due to the wildland fire knowledge and experience required of a COML.
- COMT No endorsement recommended due to the wildland fire knowledge and experience required of a COMT. Endorsement recommended if the NWCG COMT position requirements are upgraded to include S-130, S-190, L-180, and S-258.
 *To require S-130, S-190, L-180, and S-258 for all-hazards personnel, NWCG needs to require them for wildland fire personnel. The ILSC is putting a task team together to evaluate. Will need to reevaluate if the NWCG COMT qualifications are revised.
