ACCIDENT/INCIDENT SUMMARY; 11 FATALITIES AND 2 ENTRAPMENTS

93-01

The following data indicates the 1992 major accidents and entrapments associated with wildland fire suppression. There were 11 fatalities and 2 firefighters entrapped. The information was collected by the NWCG Safety & Health Working Team, with confirmation from the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).

These accidents reinforce the need for being continually alert to the "Situations That Shout Watch Out" and ensuring that all of the "10 Standard Fire Fighting Orders" are followed before initiating tactical operations.

A simple concept to remember and share with crew members is: "L.C.E.S." The acronym stands for Lookouts, Communication, Escape Routes and Safety Zones. If a fire crew has these four areas fully established and understood, then they can anticipate a safer assignment.
