## Fatalities, Entrapments and Serious Accident Summary for 2015 (<u>http://www.nwcg.gov/committees/risk-management-committee/resources</u>).

The following data indicate the fatalities, entrapments, burn-overs and other life-threatening accidents and injuries associated with wildfire in calendar year 2015. The information was collected by the NWCG Risk Management Committee, with confirmation of the fatalities from the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).

For calendar year 2015 there has been (13) fatalities:

Driving: 0

Medical Emergencies: 1 FF collapsed died responding to a grass fire; 1 pilot died while at the base; 2 FF died during the WCT; 1 FF died during a training exercise; 1 FF died after PT

Entrapment/Burn over: 4 FF died during entrapments/burnovers

Aviation: 2 FF died in helicopter crash

Hazard Tree: 1 FF died as the result of a tree strike

The Risk Management Committee would like to request any Fire Agency/Organization that experiences a fatality(s), or entrapment(s) to follow the guidance provided in <u>National Mobilization Guide, Chapter 20</u> page 48 Wildland Fire Entrapment / Fatality. In the event that a wildland fire entrapment or fatality occurs, it should be reported immediately to National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC). A Wildland Fire Entrapment/Fatality Initial Report should be completed and mailed to NICC electronically or by fax machine within twenty-four (24) hours.
