

S-130, Firefighter Training, Instructor-Led Training

Summary of Changes – 2021

As part of the NWCG system improvement efforts, training course content is directly related to the Incident Position Descriptions (IPD) derived from source documents that establish operational standards, best management practices, requirements, duties, and responsibilities.

Unit objectives have been created, restructured, modified and/or combined to improve the flow of the course. Valid objectives from the 2003 version of the course have been included in the course revision, along with objectives derived from the Firefighter Type 2 (Crewmember) (FFT2) IPD duties and responsibilities, https://www.nwcg.gov/positions/fft2/position-ipd.

Statements in the FFT2 IPD that directly correlate with the S-130 course:

- Apply the Standard Firefighting Orders and Watch Out Situations to your assignment, as stated in the *Incident Response Pocket Guide* (*IRPG*), PMS 461.
- Use Look Up, Down and Around in the *IRPG* to help maintain situational awareness. Adjust actions accordingly.
- Follow established processes and chain of command for collecting, producing, and distributing information.
- Perform wildland fire and prescribed fire duties including suppression, preparation, ignition, monitoring, holding, and mop-up. Use standard firefighting tools such as pulaskis, shovels, McLeods, chainsaws, drip torches, and fusees to do this work.

Overall Course Format Changes

- The intended course delivery will remain within the previously established timeframe of 37 41 total hours. Components will include instructor-led classroom presentations, field exercise stations, and a mandatory final field day consisting of a mock fire scenario where Student Evaluation Task Sheet will be implemented in place of a final exam.
- This course will implement the new NWCG ILT course package. The Instructor Guide and PowerPoint presentation will be accessible and available for download via the NWCG website. The Instructor Guide will feature a new format and the PowerPoint notes section will feature Instructor Notes. Both are meant to provide a facilitation model that encourages instructor/student engagement.
- All PowerPoint slides have been completely reimagined with new imagery, a new template, and updated content.
- The 10 and 18 Reference Tool has been added to Unit 5: Risk Management course materials.
- L-180, Human Factors on the Fireline is no longer included as part of this course. Students that successfully complete S-130, Firefighter Training will no longer be given credit for completing L-180, Human Factors on the Fireline.
- Course composition is still 18 units; however, units are composed and chronologically organized to guide instruction towards basic fire knowledge as a new fire fighter would receive information in the field at the beginning of both an incident and in a new position.
