## Controls

Collection, Validation, or Exchange Rules

- 1. Select Initial, Update, or Final for the current 209 being entered.
- 2. All 209s except for the Initial and Final are marked Update.
- 3. Initial the first 209 created for the Incident.
- 4. Update subsequent reports for an existing Incident.
- 5. Final the last 209 for an Incident, usually when the Incident has been declared contained, controlled, and/or when the Incident requires only minor support that can be supplied by the organization having protection responsibilities.
- 6. Select Final if the Incident's duration is one day or it is being added as a child incident into a Complex.
- 7. There should never be more than one Initial report, but there can be numerous updates, and even multiple finals (as determined by business rules).
- 8. A new entry defaults to Initial, and Update for any update.
- 9. A user must indicate Final.
- 10. Marking a 209 Final removes it from the active incident list the next day.
- 11. An Incident that has been marked as Final can be found in the Incident Reports list by clicking Only Show Final Approved? box.
- 12. Must match a valid value.
