Agenda Items:

- Fall 2024 AAR
 - October 16 – 17; NMAC will send new invitation.
 - All groups should ensure they bring constructive feedback and proposed solutions related specifically to the CIM implementation.
- Tasking and Correspondence Updates
 - Multiple NWCCG memos will be sent with IWDG notes and should be broadcast out.
 - Deadlines for basic, intermediate, and advanced courses have all been pushed out 1 year.
 - NWCCG will not be entertaining additional courses as they work through the IPTM process.
 - Comments on draft memo for archiving Type 2 and 1 positions hasn't received feedback yet.
 - Erik Litzenberg designated as IAFC liaison to NMAC.
 - Incident Support Capabilities tasking elements continue to be brought up in conversations on building capacity with non-traditional resources.
 - Waiting for further NMAC direction and engagement to continue work.
 - IMT standards, including for Type 3, will need to be revisited this winter.
- Feedback
 - Bender will combine all CIM feedback received into IWDG's inbox into one document for IWDG and NMAC to read.
 - Third party roster negotiations aren't working the way the AAs initially envisioned. AA Subgroup will continue to discuss and make recommendations this fall/winter.
 - Discussed a need or process for quality assurance of all CIMTs to ensure adequate training and consistency.
 - Comments/questions regarding Type 3 IMTs and 7 days of unavailability.
 - Important to anchor off the 7 days of unavailability as part of balance for personnel who aren't in primary fire positions and have bosses with different work expectations.
 - Have heard concerns with IMT courses being participation only vs pass/fail.
 - CIM-qualified personnel should continue coaching on incident, not just at S-520.
