Management Action Point 1 - Mule Mnt. Ridge

MAP Description: North-South Mule Mountain Ridge (From West Fork Mule Creek south along the Mule Mountain Ridge to the river, and south of the river along Stair Creek to the Wilderness boundary)

Intent: Geographic trigger point to consider notifications and coordination with collaborative entities.

Values at Risk: Marial and Rogue River Ranch Historic Site

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross during the next burn period based on current and expected fire behavior.

Probability: Low-Moderate. FSPro run from 09/10 shows a 20-79% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days on the north side of the river, and a 40-100% chance of being impacted from the Pinnacle Fire on the south side of the river. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/10 does not show fire impacting this MAP by 9/13 on the Backbone Fire, with a potential slight impact in the Stair Creek drainage from the Pinnacle Fire. Probability of MAP impact is more likely on the south side of the river from the Pinnacle Fire.

Notifications: Kelsey Peak IMT, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff

Recommended Management Action: Make notifications to listed parties and start coordination/collaboration with adjacent IMT on preparations and status updates of Values at Risk. Request updated FARSITE and FSPro runs and models from assigned IMT and/or RIST personnel.

Resources Recommended: No resource assignments or implementation actions recommended at this MAP.

Management Action Point 2 - E. Burns Creek Ridge

MAP Description: North-South ridgeline east of Burns Creek (From the 1159 Trail south along the ridge to the river, and south of the river/east of Stair Creek to the end of the 360 Road spur)

Intent: To provide for public safety and protection of identified Value at Risk.

Values at Risk: Marial and Rogue River Ranch Historic Site

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross during the next burn period based on current and expected fire behavior. Fire behavior and fire situation will dictate fire suppression resources and level of implementation, per discussions and coordination amongst Kelsey Peak and Moon Complex Operations and IC's.

Probability: Low. FSPro run from 09/10 shows a 10-39% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days on the north side of the river, and a 20-79% chance of being impacted from the Pinnacle Fire on the south side of the river. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/10 does not show fire impacting this MAP by 9/13 on either the Backbone or Pinnacle Fires.

Notifications: Kelsey Peak IMT, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff

Recommended Management Action: Coordinate with the Kelsey Peak IMT to coordinate that identified Values at Risk are protected, and provide requested resources to assist with protection, if available. Evacuate public occupying or visiting Marial/Rogue River Ranch, adjacent hiking trails, and potentially river traffic.

Resources Recommended: This MAP does not necessitate a resource response from Moon Complex IMT, but rather coordination efforts and resource sharing.

Management Action Point 3 - Brushy Bar Lodge

MAP Description: Quarter mile perimeter around Brushy Bar Lodge

Intent: Trigger point to implement water handling and structure protection within and around Brushy Bar Lodge.

Values at Risk: Brushy Bar Lodge

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross with extreme fire behavior with imminent threat to the lodge. The Pinnacle Fire has already breached the southern edge of the MAP, however due to the low fire behavior and minimal movement over past few days, this does not warrant executing any of the recommended actions.

Probability: Low-Moderate. FSPro run from 09/14 shows a 80-100% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days from either fire. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/14 shows the southwestern edge of the Backbone fire could potentially impact this MAP on 9/17.

Notifications: IC's, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff

Recommended Management Action: Start pump for water handling equipment. Personnel will not work in/ around the structures due to hazards of rolling debris and spotting potential, which could potentially entrap fire personnel.

Resources Recommended: Two personnel to start and man the pump

Management Action Point 4 - Clay Hill Lodge

MAP Description: Quarter mile perimeter around Clay Lodge

Intent: Trigger point to implement water handling and structure protection within and around Clay Hill Lodge.

Values at Risk: Clay Hill Lodge

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross with extreme fire behavior with imminent threat to the lodge.

Probability: Low FSPro run from 09/14 shows a 10-19% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/14 does not show either fire impacting this MAP by 9/17.

Notifications: IC's, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff

Recommended Management Action: Recommend evacuation of lodge staff and visitors. Start water handling and perform structure protection efforts along established control lines around the lodge.

Resources Recommended: Half of a crew (10 personnel)

Management Action Point 5 - Clay Hill Trail

MAP Description: From Bald Knob Lookout East to the Panther Ridge Trail, North-South along the Clay Hill Trail to the Rogue River and South of river West of the 700-road system to Bear Camp Road

Intent: To provide for public safety and protection of identified Values at Risk.

Values at Risk: Wild River Lodge, Big Bend and infrastructure scattered along river corridor from Illahe Lodge down river to the Community of Illahe.

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross during the next burn period based on current and expected fire behavior. Fire behavior and fire situation will dictate at what level of action is performed.

Probability: Low. FSPro run from 09/14 shows a 10-39% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/14 does not show either fire impacting this MAP by 9/17.

Notifications: IC's, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff

Recommended Management Action: Begin structure protection implementation efforts within and around identified Values at Risk. Evacuate public occupying or visiting Wild River Lodge, adjacent hiking trails, and potentially river traffic. Recommend Curry County Sheriff to put public within identified Value at Risk at a Level 2 evacuation. *Coordinate and work closely with local Fire Department and CFFPA as they have a structure protection plan for these values.

Resources Recommended: 10 Wildland Engines (Type 3, 4, 5, or 6), 3 Type 2 Water Tenders, 3 Type 2 Handcraws, 2 TFLDs, and 1 DIVS

Management Action Point 6 - Panther Ridge

MAP Description: From Flora Dell Creek in the SW corner of Section 33, Northeast to the Panther Ridge Trail, and along the trail NE to the intersection of Sections 14 and 23 just south of DP 70.

Intent: To provide for public safety and protection of identified Values at Risk. Due to the egress route for tenants occupying the Bald Knob Lookout, the intent is to evacuate the tenants prior to egress routes being compromised.

Values at Risk: Bald Knob Lookout

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross during the next burn period based on current and expected fire behavior. Fire behavior and fire situation will dictate at what level of action is performed.

Probability: Low. FSPro run from 09/14 shows a 0-19% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/14 does not show either fire impacting this MAP by 9/17.

Notifications: IC's, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff

Recommended Management Action: Recommend to the USFS and Sheriff to evacuate the Bald Knob Lookout and to not allow occupancy until conditions allow and fire management makes recommendation to do so.

Resources Recommended: This MAP does not necessitate a resource response, but rather a recommendation to the USFS and Sheriff. If the USFS and/or Sheriff requests resources from the IMT, Operations will provide requested resources if available.

Management Action Point 10 - Bear Camp Road - Road 23

MAP Description: From 3336 Road and 050 Spur Road intersection, SE to junction for 33 Road and 23 Road (Bear Camp Rd), and along 23 Road for approximately 2 miles.

Intent: To provide for public safety and protection of identified Value at Risk.

Values at Risk: Agness and surrounding area

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross during the next burn period based on current and expected fire behavior. Fire behavior and fire situation will dictate at what level of action is performed.

Probability: Low. FSPro run from 09/14 shows a <0.2% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/14 does not show either fire impacting this MAP by 9/17

Notifications: IC's, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff, OSFM

Recommended Management Action: Recommend Curry County Sheriff to put Agness and its surrounding area on Level 3 evacuations. Engage recommended resources in structure protection efforts in and around Values at Risk. *Coordinate and work closely with local Fire Department and CFFPA as they have a structure protection plan for these values.

Resources Recommended: 15 Wildland Engines (Type 3, 4, 5, or 6), 5 Type 2 Water Tenders, 3 Type 2 or better Handcraws, 3 TFLDs, and 1 DIVS *(OSFM) 2 Strike Teams of Type 1/2 Engines with appropriate leadership

Management Action Point 9 - Scott Creek

MAP Description: South of the Community of Illahe from the 3336 Road east along Lone Tree Creek, cross river along Smith Creek to Green Knob, south to the Bear Camp Road at the 900 Spur Road intersection.

Intent: To provide for public safety and protection of identified Value at Risk. Due to the egress route for public on the north side of the river, the intent is to evacuate the public prior to egress route being compromised by fire.

Values at Risk: Agness

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross during the next burn period based on current and expected fire behavior. Fire behavior and fire situation will dictate recommended action.

Probability: Low. FSPro run from 09/14 shows a 0-4% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/14 does not show either fire impacting this MAP by 9/17.

Notifications: IC's, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff, OSFM

Recommended Management Action: Recommend Curry County Sheriff to put public within and around Agness (on north side of river) at a Level 3 evacuation.

Resources Recommended: This MAP does not necessitate a resource response, but rather a recommendation to the Sheriff. If the Sheriff requests resources from the IMT, Operations will provide requested resources if available.

Management Action Point 8 - Wild River Lodge

MAP Description: Wild River Lodge at Rogue River and Slide Creek confluence

Intent: Fire crosses or threatens to cross with extreme fire behavior with imminent threat to the lodge.

Values at Risk: Wild River Lodge

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross with extreme fire behavior with imminent threat to the lodge.

Probability: Low. FSPro run from 09/14 shows a 0-4% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/14 does not show either fire impacting this MAP by 9/17.

Notifications: IC's, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff

Recommended Management Action: Start water handling and perform structure protection efforts along established control lines around the lodge.

Resources Recommended: Squad (5 personnel)

Management Action Point 7 - East Slide Creek

MAP Description: From the end of the 80-spur road off the 3730 road east to the wilderness boundary, and south across the river east of Slide Creek to the Bear Camp Road in the SW corner of section 23.

Intent: To provide for public safety and protection of identified Values at Risk.

Values at Risk: Wild River Lodge, Big Bend, and infrastructure scattered along river corridor from Illahe Lodge down river through Foster Bar, Community of Illahe to Agness.

Trigger Condition: Fire crosses or threatens to cross during the next burn period based on current and expected fire behavior. Fire behavior and fire situation will dictate at what level of action is performed.

Probability: Low. FSPro run from 09/14 shows a 0-4% chance of fire impacting this MAP within 10 days. FARSITE Near Term Modelling on 9/14 does not show either fire impacting this MAP by 9/17.

Notifications: IC's, Agency Administrators (USFS, BLM, ODF-CFFPA), and Curry County Sheriff, OSFM

Recommended Management Action: For this MAP, two Management Actions are recommended.

1. Recommend Curry County Sheriff to put Wild River Lodge, Big Bend, and infrastructure scattered along river corridor from Illahe Lodge down river through Foster Bar, Community of Illahe south to the Coon Bridge on Level 3 evacuations. Engage recommended resources in structure protection efforts in and around Values at Risk. *Coordinate and work closely with local Fire Department and CFFPA as they have a structure protection plan for these values.
2. Begin structure protection implementation efforts south of the Community of Illahe to Agness, on the north and south side of river. Evacuate public occupying or visiting Wild River Lodge, adjacent hiking trails, and potentially river traffic. Recommend Curry County Sheriff to put public within and around Agness at a Level 2 evacuation. *Coordinate and work closely with local Fire Department and CFFPA as they have a structure protection plan for these values.

Resources Recommended: Recommended Management Action 1: 10 Wildland Engines (Type 3, 4, 5, or 6), 3 Type 2 Water Tenders, 3 Type 2 or better Handcraws, 2 TFLDs, and 1 DIVS *(OSFM) 2 Strike Teams of Type 1/2 Engines with appropriate leadership

Recommended Management Action 2: 15 Wildland Engines (Type 3, 4, 5, or 6), 5 Type 2 Water Tenders, 3 Type 2 Handcraws, 3 TFLDs, and 1 DIVS
