Subject: Approval of Incident and Position Standards Committee Request for Change

2020-15, Reorganization of Dispatch Positions

Purpose: This memorandum approves the content of Incident and Position Standards Committee (IPSC) Request for Change (RFC) 2021-15 received from the National Coordination System Committee.

Action: The attached qualification sheets outline the approved position requirements for the Expanded Dispatch Recorder (EDRC), Initial Attack Dispatcher (IADP) and the Aircraft Dispatcher (ACDP) positions. Currently qualified and trainee responders in each of the respective positions will be subject to the following action plan:

- Qualified IADP and ACDP: Historical recognition will be used for all current qualified responders upon updating of the *NWCG Standards for Wildland Fire Position Qualifications* (PMS 310-1) on October 1, 2021.
- **IADP and ACDP Trainees:** Those responders who are trainees on October 1, 2021 must meet the new qualification requirements as outlined in the NWCG Position Catalog.

The change will be effective and reflected in the NWCG position catalog on October 1, 2021.

Background and Coordination: The dispatch and aviation communities identified the need to reevaluate (ACDP) qualification requirements to build a more experienced and capable aviation dispatch community supporting wildland fire and resource aviation needs. The current pathway to ACDP is to be qualified as an (EDRC). The EDRC dispatch position is the most basic level of dispatch while the ACDP is one of the most complex. Realignment of positions and additional training requirements will allow responders to gain knowledge and skills to move from the basic (EDRC) position to the intermediate (IADP) level, to the most advanced level of (ACDP). This realignment also provides multiple paths for entry level dispatchers to advance in qualifications through the IADP-ACDP and expanded dispatch paths. Changes to the positions were vetted and supported by the National Interagency Aviation Committee and NWCG training program.
