Standard Operating Principles and Plan Review

- Capturing updates via tracked changes in SOP.
- Check with NWCG Executive Board representative for DoD and InterTribal Timber Council to see if
 there is a desire for primary representation to CEPC. In addition, check with NASA about
 representation. Informed by Katy O'Hara that InterTribal Timber Council does not have any

representation on any committees/subcommittees – if they need to voice something, they do so via BIA representative. Also, if there is a desire to add DoD representative, write a request to Katy and she will begin the process.

 External Affairs representative will return to an associate member role vs. a primary role as they are not represented on the NWCG Executive Committee. They will no longer be eligible to hold chair or vice chair.

<u>Presentation – CommA - Jane Darnell, Joel Iverson w/Allison Mims, Visual Specialist, and Amber Ortega, Smoke Scientist</u>

- Want to change how the agencies and communities communicate about wildland fire and smoke
- Smoke is what gets the attention, and draws attention to a fire whether prescribed or wild
- Look at framing, narratives what, how, and when we communication. How has CommA members been engaging in that process of communication on the ground
- High stress moments are not the time to introduce messages, it is the time for listening, caring, and empathy. Messages can be emphasized if introduced before, during low-stress situations
- Perception of efficacy > perception of hazard people go into problem-solving mode; just the opposite
 people go into fear mode
- Environmental psychology that feeling of safeness when seeing something like smoke. Why readiness should include smoke readiness.
- Put smoke in messaging first because smoke is more visible and has bigger potential impact
- What will wildland fire find when it arrives? What did we leave for the next wildland fire?
 - Emphasizes strategies and actions emphasis on right place, right conditions
 - Using opportunities (crises) as they arise e.g., when a wildfire is happening elsewhere, use it as an opportunity for messaging about "what will wildland fire find when it arrives in our community?"
- There is no future without wildland fire or smoke, so where do we have the efficacy to use that opportunity for the narrative?
- Preparing the public to **receive** smoke so they can have more control over their exposure
- Opportunities for system shift environmental justice, social, etc. leads to paradigm shift
 - Paradigm shift changes thinking at a deephttps://www.nwcg.gov/committee-roles-and-membership-information level; paradoxes exist; fire and smoke paradox. Deeper level of meaning allows shift. How do we move BEYOND paradox to understanding the system?
 - People understand their place in relation to wildland fire
- War on raises concern, but is not actionable

PIOSC – Kerry

Below is a summary of what was approved in the PARR meeting and pushed forward to IPSC through the IPTM process.

PIOT:

- Add S-110, Basic Wildland Fire Orientation Optional Units as other training which supports knowledge and skills. (specifically Unit 3 which is PIO specific)
- Add 'Day in the Life' OLT module from S-203, Introduction to Incident Information, to other training which supports knowledge and skills.
- Change the PIOT position name to remove the Officer identifier, PIOT is not trained or intended to perform Public Information Officer functions without significant supervision.

PIO3:

- Remove PIOT qualification prerequisite requirement for PIO3.
- Require S-110, Basic Wildland Fire Orientation if PIOT is removed as a prerequisite.
- Remove L-380, Fireline Leadership from other training which supports knowledge and skills.
- *NO CHANGE* Require ICS-400, Advanced ICS for Command and General Staff
- Revise S-203 Introduction to Incident Information, consider blended delivery (some online units)****Please consider that as S-203 is revised the next level of Information Officer Specific Training will need to be considered as the course is revised. Despite the fact that THIS contract may not cover training for a PIOC, subject-specific training will likely be recommended and needed to progress to the next level****
