- 1. <u>Participants:</u> Chris, Ryan, Dan, Matt, Brent, Joe Flores, David, Nate, Tonja, Mitch, Steve Stolze, Cheryl, Rocco, Andrew, Nicole
- 2. IPTM Update (Joe F.)
 - a. Meeting week was successful
 - i. Contractors walked us through it well
 - ii. Waiting for contractors for touch ups on what they talked about
 - iii. Contractor will send out a summary
 - b. Highlights of Mtg
 - i. Wasn't any debate keeping DIVS for FBAN
 - ii. Push to have FBAN count for DIVS assignments
 - iii. Similar language in standards but may mean something different
 - 1. FBAN more tactical
 - 2. LTAN more strategic
 - 3. How these positions integrated in the IMT
 - iv. RX fire assignments can count towards task book
 - 1. Utilizing fire analysts to help with burning
 - 2. Don't want a FBAN with just RX training assignments
 - a. Need a wildfire assignment or assignments
 - v. Virtual Decision Support Centers used for lots of LTAN assignments
 - 1. Will need LTAN on-scene IMT assignments to get signed off
 - vi. What does supervision look like for FBAN and LTANs
 - vii. How do the changes impact current training like S-590
 - Have had some discussions with steering committee since class coming up
 - 2. Emphasis on briefings and providing good info/interpretation
 - 3. Chris: steering committee came up with a set standard for grading the 4 exercises and briefing templates standardized
 - c. Q&A:
 - i. Cheryl: did you talk about S-491 fire danger?
 - 1. Incident analysis piece to fire danger a big gap
 - 2. Joe: will show up in new standards but didn't talk about changing classes to meet the needs
 - 3. Cheryl: haven't taught how to use fire danger on an incident
 - a. Gap has occurred because S-491 teaches preplanning/preparedness analysis and not so much incident analysis

- 4. Joe: main thing in standards right now is knowing how to extract data and run climo in FFplus or FEMS (didn't narrow it down to the program used since a changing landscape), compare historical trends to current
 - Also discuss other tools analysts might use is getting FDOP from local unit and being able to reach/understand/interpret it vs creating an FDOP
 - b. May mean changes to S-491 or something else
 - c. Another factor playing into this is FEMS
 - d. Stay away from naming the model (i.e. like using WFDSS vs stand-alone)
- ii. Chris asked Cheryl about S-491 in fall
 - 1. WIMS gone in Sep/Oct so will be different from past classes
 - 2. New class may be more geared towards FBAN/LTANs
 - a. Planning part may get kicked up to the S-591 course
- iii. Chris brought up some comments thoughts about making sure there is continuity between the 90 series classes
 - 1. Some people would like to see more spatial modeling in S-490 (not just Behave)
 - a. Chris: believe FLAMMAP may have been decided
 - i. Key is teaching the models and not the UI
 - 2. Chris: how do we get that continuity
 - a. Heather/Joe Hernandez are the only ones on both S-390/490
 - Both Matt/Mitch/Andrew agree a state or federal person (perhaps from this committee) should sit on both as they are created
 - c. Action Item: Andrew will be that go-between
 - i. Chris will send info to Kevin and provide link to Andrew
- 3. S-290 Updates (Mitch/Chris)
 - a. From NWCG
 - i. Contractor made corrections to OLT during Jan.
 - ii. NWCG publications received it
 - iii. Course potentially completed by Feb 28th 2025
 - b. Mitch changed some font/bolding with new templates
 - c. Rocco took some training to be able to copy the shell so can make some modifications
 - Need to be a Content Creator so need to take Editing Trainer course thru Wildland Fire Training Portal
 - d. Chris assumes GATRs would be able to do that for federally taught classes

4. S-390 Updates (Matt)

- a. Not much to add
- b. Materials turned over to developer in prep for test course
- c. Will meet with cadre this week to give background
- d. Test course in March
 - i. Will basically be Great Basin course
- e. Includes pre-course stuff and 4.5 days of instructor led
- f. Used a generic name not wanting to tie to a specific software package since that can change over the years

5. S-490 Updates (Tonja/David)

- a. Waiting for NWCG to give thumbs up on training development plan
- b. Holding mode right now
- c. Class: Kirk/Joe/Richie (3 GACCs combined)
 - i. Oct 20th to 24th in Tucson Interagency Fire Center
 - ii. Announcement on March 17th
 - iii. Probably around 30 students with 10 per GACC
- d. Tonja isn't aware of any future course development calls

6. Mann Gulch (Dan)

- a. How to incorporate Mann Gulch videos into refresher RT-130 module
- b. Action Item: Dan will reach out and Chris will give him a contact

7. <u>Budget 2026</u> (Chris)

- a. \$15,000 ever 2 years for Mitch to do updates to our guides (i.e. FBFRG)
 - i. Unsure about getting funding for labor
- b. Dan's wind reduction factor updates
 - i. DOD has verbally said they would fund it but things have changed since that verbal commitment

8. Mitch Updates (Mitch)

- a. Alaska Fire Consortium funding from NWCG
 - i. Did it for 3 years
 - ii. NWCG funding has dried up
 - iii. Will be stepping out on March 26th 2025
- b. Will be retiring all together on summer solstice
- c. If funding from NWCG doesn't come thru and/or Alaska can't find someone to replace Mitch then we will likely have to take it on
 - i. 2 update cycles in the past
 - 1. Early May before Summer
 - 2. October before Winter
 - ii. Need to contact NWCG Publishing (Erika Lam)
 - 1. Paper guide, web versions
 - 2. Posters
 - iii. Get info to Erika and she passes off to the publishers

- iv. Process for Update ("edit work doc"):
 - 1. Paper Guide (pdf): need to convert it to Word version and make edits thru Track Changes and Comments
 - Web Guide: save the page as a word doc (some tricks depending on operating system you are using), make track changes/comments, html coding skills could be helpful

d. Future

- i. New CFFDRS will be coming out this year
 - 1. American's likely won't build in the new changes until 2026
- ii. Guides/Posters
 - 1. Pretty up to date
 - 2. Fire Danger updated on the online guide
 - a. Talk about restructuring S-491
 - 3. Update tables
 - 4. Add Vortices section
 - a. Might take some of that from S-290
 - 5. Regional Wx Patterns
 - a. May get rid of it or spruce it up in Fire Wx handbook
 - 6. Poster 5 panel idea
- e. Comments:
 - i. Cheryl: need to push this up to FENC since all groups impacted
- 9. KAS Update (Dan)
 - a. Last bit of \$\$\$ left
 - b. Emails between Heather and KAS group
 - c. New program called "Wildlander"
 - d. New game deployed next week
