- NWCG News (Carmen Thomason)
 - New coordinators have been hired and there will be a slight change in who is assigned to each committee
- Teams Folders
- Fire Shelters
 - Non-spec status
 - The DOJ has declined the case to purse the manufacturer the case was referred to the State of AZ and they have the ability to purse the case if they would like.
 - o "Gap" topic
 - DHS First Responder resource group is working on reviewing documents and it is similar to a life cycle evaluation. Considerations being in a sealed envelope, double occupancy and increased protection from water. Component evaluation is could also be included in this such as looking at each portion of the shelter not the entire product. Still in the process of the collaborative effort needs to continue. This could also be an opportunity to recruit a DHS person to ETC/fire shelter-PPE subcommittee as a liaison or to ask for an ETC person to represent the wildland community to the DHS First Responder group.
 - Shelter specifications package has been updated along with the materials tolerance package to DLA for contracting. Changes that were made were related to better testing and new technology. Testing has been updated to be annual to allow the manufacture time to get things in place and be able to stay on top of testing issued related to a year not to a contract cycle.
 - An additional company has come forward to start manufacturing shelters and information and testing protocols has been shared with them regarding specifications but more to come and they will have to respond to contracting.
 - Mystery ranch is still working on moving forward on their wear trial and the bag type for a potential new fold. They could go to each agencies and ask the employees to wear test if they keep moving forward and to have an alternative folding method then it would come back to NWCG and a Red Book change. It

would be a specification and a drawing change for a new fold style. When testing starts need to brief the EB.

- Respirators
 - o DRAFT Bulletin
 - o IMRR PowerPoint-shared in email and on the call
 - There are respirators that are being marketed for wildland fire and there is interest in the product the question becomes are the appropriate or safe for fire line use. There is a person from OSHA who has been tasked with review and concerns have been brought forward about consulting with the states and the federal agencies for evaluation of this product. There have been some wear trails and one recently in LA county. More data is still needed to evaluate this product and it is a challenge. Other considerations are medical standards as well as carbon monoxide associated with respirator protection and monitoring for that specifically. There remain a lot of questions and data needed to assess this reporter. This will need to be taken on as a specific project as it has a lot of reach into the fire community as well as the technology and standards behind respirators. There are also concerns about how to communicate about this issue of smoke to firefighters as well as managers and how to identify smoke as a risk and the associated mitigations that can link back to the respirator issue.
 - Players in this issue include OSHS, NFPA, NIOSH and it is important to ensure that all the right people are included in discussion and sharing their concerns.
 - Nothing is approved yet and concerns have been shared that this is not a single issue that firefighters depending on the type of fire and fuel type need different types of respirator protection.
 - Another issue is the long-term situation about smoke and colleting data about people how have been exposed for years and what the different data that comes out of that and this could be a multi-year process. If smoke is the known hazard it also has implications to other responders outside the arduous firefighter, does this imply reparatory protection for camp or IMT members?
 - Discussion on is there need to do some type of safety warning or alert on this product/ issue. The message from NFPA is that responders need analyze a product and see if it meets their responder needs. Consideration for the time of year for an alert or safety message and its relationship to fire season and RX burning. The red book is also currently open for updates and langue could be submitted to that change. The NWCG Executive Board could also be asked if they would send out a message about firefighter health and welfare, RMC or ETC are also known and trusted sources for these types of safety alerts or bulletins, links to additional information could be included in a safety message. This message needs to address the who, what firefighters and the conditions, can we provide any options of products, what the policy is. What can be done now or not? Define what a respirator is or is not and it is not an N95 mask or an SCBA.

- The group will continue to pursue a respirator safety alert/ message from NWCG and the additional effort of getting OSHA, NIOSH, NFPA and others to discus and evaluate the issue.
- Boots
 - Project is on schedule for early 2024 looking at comparison of types and a potential recommendations for FF and chain saw operators and there is a type in to OHA that is law level with the logging standard. Could provide some refined red book language and recommendations to agency leadership.
- Helmets
 - NFPA 1977 let last week for the first time after the fire season looking at internal standards and exposure recommendations such as lateral protection. NFPA standard is what is referred to and how could that verbiage be made better and a public comment period was opened for a year and then in February the group will review the comments and move forward. Have any changes been made to electrical conductivity? No, nothing has been changed related to electrical conductivity. BIA did a wear test on helments and three different brands of helmets went to hot shot crews and helitack crews for testing and information needs to be collected on that wear test. BIA should have data to share with feedback in the future.

Swampers should wear chaps when the need is demonstrated by a risk analysis considering proximity to the sawyer, slope, fuel type, etc. All other chainsaw chaps must be removed from service. Chainsaw chaps shall be maintained in accordance with MTDC Publication, Inspecting and Repairing Your Chainsaw Chaps – User Instructions (0567-2816-MTDC) available at https://www.fs.usda.gov/t-8 d/php/library_card.php?p_num=0451%202324P.

 - Leg Protection:
 - 0
 - All chainsaw operators will wear leg protection that meets the United States Forest Service Specification 6170-4F, 4G, or newer or the National Fire Protection Association Standard (NFPA) 1977: Standard on Protective Clothing and Equipment for Wildland Fire Fighting and Urban Interface Fire Fighting. Swampers should wear leg protection when the need is demonstrated by a risk analysis considering the proximity to the sawyer, slope, fuel type, etc. All other chainsaw leg protection must be removed from service. Chainsaw leg protection shall be maintained in accordance with manufacturer instructions.
