10:15 Liz Younger	Item 2: RFC – A454 Airframe Designation -Decisional - Current A454 evaluated and qualified instructors can create a course for all the options within the A454 course creation screen. However, not every instructor that has been evaluated for A454 is qualified to teach every platform/course within the selection options. An example is a FQ Instructor that was evaluated while teaching a Parrot Anafi course can create a course for the Alta-X, which is a different ground control station and application. We have already seen some of this occur within IAT. Insert a sub-qualification for all instructors to create a specific A454-Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS) Add-on Course offering in IAT for all fully qualified instructors. All Instructors must be current and qualified to teach each A454 course individually and carded on the airframe or hold a current enforcement for the specific course. Agencies/Bureaus will manage qualified instructors by issuing a designation letter/per platform from the National/Washington Office level and follow the IAT instructor certification process in the IAT guide. Kessler 10:30	Item 3: A209 revision SME group brief/Memo 23-01 Aircrew Manager Pathway Gap- Informational - The A-209 Helicopter Operations Course Revision Group has identified a skills/knowledge gap between aircrew member qualification and aircraft (RW/FW) manager qualification found in the IAT Guide. Currently some Agencies/Bureaus are filling the skills/knowledge gap by requiring aircrew members to take the S-271 Helicopter Crewmember Training produced by NWCG. The S-Course training is designed specifically for Fire Helicopter Crew Members (HECM) and requires the completion of a position task book (PTB) prior to full qualification in IQCS. NWCG is a performance-based system that requires a combination of training and performance. Suggested Solution: Develop a course for Aircrew members that bridges the skills/knowledge gap between basic aircrew member and manager (helicopter / fixed wing) positions in IAT. Which position will the training be required for?		

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can we create a new position in the aviation position development path to help close the gap i.e – Passenger – Special Use (A-100, A-200), Aircrew Member (A-100, A-110, A-200, A-XXX) Helicopter Flight Manager (current plan + A-XXX) Fixed Flight Manger (current plan + A-XXX) Helicopter Manger – Special Use (current plan + A-XXX) Fixed Wing Flight Manager – Special Use (current plan + A-XXX) <p>The A209 SME group will develop a list of skills/knowledge they can clearly articulate are missing in the gap between aircrew member and the manager positions. These need to be clearly defined and missing from the existing training courses required for the positions. It is suggested a table to easily display the gap. This will need to be routed through the IATS, NIAC, OAS SLT, EAS, and USFS leadership prior to approval to begin development. Please note the solution above is just a suggestion, the SME group for A-209 should look at all the possibilities to reduce the impact to the current training system while achieving the objective.</p> <p>Input from all Bureaus what the effect would be?
