Group is to update the current option and come up with additional option for 2023. Executive Board will conduct AAR next fall to review the analytics of which option was used by units.</li> <li>Qualifications &amp; Taskbooks <ul> <li>All Hazard IMTs not removing Type 1 &amp; 2.</li> <li>NWCG should not remove Type 1 &amp; 2 qualifications at this time but evaluate shutting the pathway down to these qualifications and just offer CIM taskbooks.</li> <li>Additional tasks included in the CIM taskbooks revolved around the strategic risk assessment. Taskbooks were provided to NIMO for review and edits. IPSC will review edited package.</li> <li>Will need further evaluation with FEMA to see what kind of CIM positions can be added.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Noted the importance of communicating the right language around the transition to CIM teams.</li> </ul>

There will be no Type 1 or 2.</li> <li>There are only a certain number of tools in the toolbox.</li> <li>Looking at NWCG wildland fire only.</li> <li>S-420 &amp; S-520 courses are going to need modifications.</li> <li>Will need alignment with the O-305 &amp; S-420 courses.</li> <li>S-520 is the advanced IMT training needed for CIM.</li> <li>Would need basic IMT training before opening a taskbook.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Short term <ul> <li>Looks at 2023 only.</li> <li>In order for a Type 3 or Unit level resource to move to CIM they would need to take either L-481, S-420 or O-305.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	

				<ul> <li>Complete I-400 and the CIM taskbook. Then complete S-520 or complete the field evaluation.</li> <li>Don't anticipate a lot of movement to CIM in the short term as it was recognized that most course deliveries and nominations are set for 2023 and either people are slotted for the training or already have it.</li> <li>Midterm <ul> <li>Looks at 2024 through 2026.</li> <li>Type 3 level - to gain a CIM qualification a resource would need to take either L-481, S-420 or O-305, complete the CIM taskbook and complete S-520.</li> <li>Unit leader - to gain a CIM qualification a resource would need to take either L-481, S-420 or O-305, complete the CIM taskbook and complete S-520.</li> <li>Unit leader - to gain a CIM qualification a resource would need to take either L-481, S-420 or O-305, complete I-400, complete the CIM taskbook and complete S-520.</li> <li>Discussed the idea of a CIM Mentorship program, with the concept around basic IMT training being done in the field with an IMT.
