CURRICULUM AND PROJECT UPDATES

VALUES AND PRINCIPLES UPDATE

- Ellsworth has been assisting with reviewing the principles.
- Pandemic response has stalled progress.
- Recommend bumping up to LC for final review.
 - CMLs and task group members will complete a thorough review of revised values and principles in the coming weeks.
 - Eric Walker will submit to LC for review and feedback.

LEADERSHIP LEVELS

- Mike will contact L-380 and L-381 CMLs for final review of the leadership levels.
- Shultz will add additional information for L-480 if he is available.
- Hoping for final version to be complete by May 1.

L-180/280

- New curriculum maps being built for both L-180/280 courses.
- Course objectives assessed and aligned with unit objectives.
- Updates planned to incorporate unit objectives.
- The concepts under the new objectives have been outlined; reference materials for those concepts have been identified.

- L-180 has been reviewed by NWCG Training Development. L-180 now has a rough timeline for completion, as well as a funding mechanism.
- The online delivery of L-180 has been examined.
- A challenge has been aligning the course and unit objectives for L-180/L-280.
- A "test course" is planned for Summer 2021 for L-180; 2022, for L-280.
- Values and principles intertwine with planned course material.
- The NWCG curriculum map has "holes" and redundancies that present challenges.
- Working on fixing and reorganizing the curriculum map to make it more efficient. The improved curriculum map can be used by other CMLs.

<u>L-380</u>

- Course objectives developed at Santa Fe meeting are confirmed to still be valid.
- The 7 Cs are subject to review and revision.
- Stress First Aid is a separate course; distinguishing importance of 7 Cs in L-380.
- The CMU has reviewed course changes and approved them.
- Curriculum map has been reviewed for use by providers.
- Stress management and PTSD Center material being incorporated into L-380.
- More discussion on whether L-380 should be targeted at the single resource boss level.
- Proposed course name change being reconsidered. Will bring new issue to the LC at item at their next meeting.

<u>L-381</u>

- Jake Akerberg was approved as a new L-381 instructor.
- Incorporating Stress First Aid and Booster Shots into curriculum.

<u>L-481</u>

- No major updates.
- Talked to Mark Smith; there are some concerns regarding risk management and how the current situation will change field/course interaction.
- Stress First Aid would fit well into course scenarios and discussions.
- There will be a wait list for courses due to current virus conditions and course cancelations.

<u>L-580</u>

- Mike Ellsworth will replace Chris Wilcox as CML. LC will formalize at next meeting. Structure will move from steering group to CML like other courses.
- L-580 offerings this spring have been cancelled.
- L-580, Leading in Crisis (alternate version to the San Diego County Mega Fire Case Study) was conducted in Redding, CA.
 - Dan Buckley (NPS) evaluated course delivery and determined the model does meet the intent and standard for an L-580.

- History: The alternate course was first introduced at the IAFC meeting last year in Reno.
 Due to furlough the course has never been reviewed.
- Working on a final review that will be sent to LCMSC and agency representatives for approval by next week.

BOOSTER SHOTS

- Booster Shots provide leadership education between L-courses.
- Two options were presented to the LC. Agency representatives are hesitant to make Booster Shots a requirement.
 - LC recommends expanding course prework.
 - CMLs suggest best location for prework is at the L-280 and L-380 levels.
- Booster Shots will be an agenda item on the next face-to-face LC meeting.
 - Need to identify what content would be most beneficial for each course.

RT-130 CORE COMPETENCIES REVIEW

An IPSC task team is evaluating RT-130 core competencies/requirements.
 One proposal is to focus on human factors and decision making. This may be an opportunity for the LC to have a larger influence on RT-130.

TRAINING/QUALIFICATIONS

- Training officers are trying to increase capacity in order to help maintain qualifications.
- Discussion on how the LC/LCMSC could use the Wildland Fire Learning Portal to push products (e.g., Booster Shots) forward.
 - Topic recommended for the next LC agenda.

MISCELLANEOUS

Pam McDonald:

- Social media is focusing on resiliency in light of current situation.
- Request for more help with social media support during current situation.

Joe Williams:

- Proposes another LCMSC call.
- Possibility of using Microsoft Teams for the LC. This would allow for better communication and LC networking.
