July minutes review and approval	Approved.
Group discussed status of action items from prior meeting.	
 NWCG Standards for Resource Typing, PMS 200 Draft web portal for the new publication was presented to the NIAC members. Intent is to locate all resource typing standards in one location to make them easier to reference and update. The Wildland Fire Incident Management Field Guide, PMS 210, currently holds most of the typing standards. The standards are broken out by categories: aircraft, crews, and equipment. Airtanker Base Directory App Change Protocols The Airtanker Base Directory Unit (IABDU) and IABS members would have authorization to make minor changes to the information in the directory app, including updates to phone numbers and email addresses, personnel and agency contact changes, and hazards. This information would be sent to the Directory Unit from the field as changes happen, allowing the app to be as current as possible. NIAC would have the oversight and final authority to make major changes to the directory app information such as, adding and removing bases, changes in base capabilities, or status changes of the base (i.e. permanent, CWN or temporary). The IABDU would be responsible for working with the Communications Duty Office/Officer (CDO) on listing approved frequencies. This will happen at least every spring and more often if there are changes throughout the season. The IABDU will make the changes in the app as soon as CDO sends them the approved frequency list or changes. The approval process of major changes would consist of the IABDU pushing the change request to IABS who would forward to the respective agency NIAC members. Once IABS got the approval from NIAC, they would send it to the IABDU to make the changes in the app. Anticipate April 2020 for release. 	NIAC will validate the aircraft standards specifically looking to update the aircraft examples. Will coordinate with Jesse Bender to update the website prior to going live. Approved.

S-372, Helicopter Management Course Issue	Josh Haney will ask the Interior Business
 The course was last certified in March 2009. It has come to the attention of NWCG Training that the contracting section of the course is inaccurate and out of date. Would like to update the section without going through a full course revision. NIAC members suggest the option to use the Aviation Training course, A-306 Aviation Contract Administration in place of the out of date section in the current S-372 course. Would need to reach out to the Interior Business Center (IBC) as a contracting officer is only authorized to teach this course at the present time. If the option is approved in November, NIAC will draft a joint letter from USFS/DOI to the NWCG 	Center (IBC) if A-306 Aviation Contract Administration would meet the intent of the contracting unit in S-372, Helicopter Management Course Issue.
