 Forest Service Requirements for Aircraft Dispatcher (ACDP) Members discussed the proposal to modify the alignment and prerequisite requirements from Expanded Dispatch Recorder (EDRC), for Aircraft Dispatcher (ACDP), and Initial Attack Dispatcher (IADP) in an effort to build a more experienced and capable aviation dispatch community supporting wildland fire and resource aviation needs. The reorganization would include aviation related education and training that supports a solid foundation in aviation knowledge and increased skills and abilities. Additionally, the proposed training that will be added to the IADP position will qualify that position to perform basic aviation dispatching and flight following tasks. This will potentially alleviate the burden of having to maintain an ACDP staffing during all aviation operations. The recommended path for qualification to ACDP would be changed to a requirement of being a qualified IADP prior to advancing to ACDP. 	NIAC members will be given one week to review for approval.
