IFUASS took that requirement out of PMS-515, but would like NIAC to revisit the decision. AI academy roster set in the short term, but looking to get an answer for any classes offered in the fall. Kelly reported that IFUASS can work with the current status, but would like to have a decision later in the summer. IFUASS will continue to review content and what they are experiencing regarding qualifications. Recommend having IFUASS update NIAC in June. IFASS will update briefing

Asked why can't an airtanker base manager not serve as an ASGS. Baldwin provided Matt some background on why this wasn't supported. Matt thinks there is a path to make this work. USFS national level and regions have looked at options. Asked air tanker base community who was interested in this change. Matt reported that a briefing paper should be completed by June to brief NIAC. Matt said there might be some shortcoming in the helicopter community, but can probably mitigate the concerns. 77 air tanker bases (150 people) could be affected. Stan said USFS supports. USFS has been working with Matt, and IABS could support the effort. Brian reported that he believes there is a path forward to success. Jake agrees there are some shortcomings but there are similarities. Could be difficult, but CalFire would like a HCWN (HMGB) or HECM qual. Matt thinks this could be a tasking to IHOpS and IATs to work out some of the specifics. Stan – this topic has been discussed previously but can wait to get this resolved and a decision made this summer/fall for use next season. Mike opined it could work but more work needed by the subcommittees. Stan – IABS provide a letter of support and how it would work. Survey will help with showing the numbers involved. Recommend this topic be revisited – Matt can report</p>
