Status: Approved

Description

The expected containment or completion date of the incident.

Business Rules

1. Date and time must both be reported.
2. This applies only to wildfires, not to prescribed fires.
3. Time may be entered in 12hr or 24hr format and use local or UTC to designate time zone, but stored in 24hr UTC format.
4. Date-time display must be in a human readable format: MM/DD/YYYY with HH:MM on a 24-hour clock.
5. Date-time is exchanged in Epoch format.
